During these forty-one years of this special partnership, based on shared values, and adapted in the face of changing circumstances and priorities, we have witnessed significant contributions towards the development aspirations of ACP countries, commercial benefits to European enterprises as well as significant milestones in our shared quest to play a significant, if not decisive role, in the global political and development agenda. While our partnership at the CoP 21 in Paris last December provided the platform for the formation of the “Ambition Coalition” that played such a decisive role in ensuring a successful outcome, it is worth noting that this was just a replication of the decisive role played by the ACP Group in multilateral trade

negotiations, from Hong Kong to Nairobi, and often with the support of the EU. It is clear that the strength of our collective numbers has been brought to bear time and again, even though there is scope to leverage this great asset in a more consistent and strategic manner.

trying to acknowledge the presence of each and every one of them individually. Therefore, Excellencies Eminent Personalities, I welcome you all, and look forward to a robust yet informed debate. The business of our Joint ACP-EU Council will also require understanding and considerable flexibility to address contentious issues as related to the Economic Partnership Agreement – but we are strongly encouraged that the sense of goodwill and mutual benefit will prevail.

In conclusion, allow me to reiterate how happy and privileged we are to have with us today His Excellency President Macky SALL, and we look forward to welcoming him soon among our midst once again, hopefully at the 8th Summit of our Heads of State and Government in Port Moresby.
