Let me quickly turn to why we are here today. As you are probably aware, the Georgetown Agreement which constitutes the founding charter of the ACP Group back in 1975, as well as the Cotonou Partnership Agreement between the ACP and the EU, enjoin us to work hand in hand with non-state actors. To this end, the ACP Group has been taking concrete steps to reinforce its working relations with non-state actors. These include establishing a Civil Society Forum from ACP countries, as well as platforms for interface with the private sector. To date however, no comparable forum exists in relation to the press and media from ACP countries; hence the need for a Federation of ACP Press Clubs. Our expectation therefore is that at the end of the Congress a Charter would be agreed upon, establishing the foundation for the Federation of ACP Press Clubs, together with a roadmap that identifies the next steps from here, how to bring on board ACP countries not represented here today, as well as the priority issues and activities of the Federation, going forward. For the ACP Group however, it is envisaged that in the near future the Federation will start to play a crucial role in enhancing visibility and public education regarding the activities of the ACP Group, given your capacity as multipliers of information, outreach to a wide variety of stakeholders, and your potential influence over public opinion.

Given the calibre of representation here today, we are already quite optimistic about the outcomes of your deliberations over the next two days.

In conclusion therefore, please allow me to wish you successful deliberations on behalf of the Secretary General, H.E. Dr. Patrick GOMES, who would have loved to be here today but had to attend to other pressing matters back in Brussels. We look forward to working with you towards implementation of the outcomes of the Congress, in collaboration with our partners, particularly the European Union.
