Forty-seven years ago, representatives of African, Caribbean and Pacific States gathered in Guyana to sign the Georgetown Agreement, bringing into being a group of States, which shared a common history and similar cultures even though they lived continents apart. They came together to jointly pursue the political and social-economic development of their countries for the benefit of their peoples

At the 9th Summit of ACP Heads of State and Government, held in December 2019 in Nairobi, Kenya, the Leaders took a defining step; by adopting the revised **Georgetown Agreement**, and reshaping the ACP Group of States into an international organisation, now known as the **Organisation of African Caribbean and Pacific States (OACPS)**.

As President-in-Office of the OACPS Summit of Heads of State and Government, it is with immense pleasure and pride that I congratulate our Organisation on the commemoration of its 47th anniversary at the same time; as we, also, celebrate the observance of the 2nd anniversary

of OACPS Foundation Day, under the theme: '**OACPS: Innovation and Resilience**'.
